

Regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, held July 12, 1940.

PRESENT: Mayor Bouyea, Aldermen Holland, O'Connell, Delaney, Golden, Behan and Tyrell.

By Alderman GOLDEN; seconded by Alderman BEHAN :

LOCAL LAW NO. 4 of 1940.

ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR MILK INSPECTOR POSITION TO BE CREATED UNDER AND BY OPEN-COMPETITIVE CIVIL SERVICE REGULATIONS AND PRESCRIBING DUTIES AND COMPENSATION THEREFOR.

BE IT ENACTED by the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to appoint a Milk Inspector under open competitive Civil Service Regulations. The qualifications required for such position shall be as follows:

(a) Graduation from a high school and completion of a course of instruction in milk sanitation approved by the public health council as qualifying for this grade, provided that such person shall have had not less than one year of satisfactory full-time experience in milk sanitation; or

(b) Completion of a course of instruction in milk sanitation approved by the public health council as qualifying for this grade, provided that such person shall have had not less than three years of satisfactory full-time experience in milk sanitation; or,

(c) Any combination of education, training, and experience which in the opinion of the public health council is the equivalent of any of the above qualifications.


Section 2. The salary for this position shall be One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per annum, payable semi-monthly on payrolls to be audited and approved by the Mayor and the Secretary of the Municipal Civil Service Commission.

Section 3. The duties of the position shall be performed under the supervision of the Health Officer and shall include inspection of all milk pasteurizing plants, receiving stations and wholesale firms handling milk for consumption in the City; the physical examination of all cows furnishing milk for consumption in the City; the collection and delivery to the Laboratory of samples of milk and cream for examination; and such other actions relative to milk sanitation as may be required of him by the Health Officer. He shall devote an average of twenty-four (24) hours per week to his official duties. He shall also make monthly reports of his activities to the Common Council and to the Board of Health.

On roll call, Aldermen Holland, O'Connell, Golden, Delaney, Behan and Tyrell voted in the affirmative; no one in the negative.


