AN ACT


to amend and supersede the time and method of taking effect of ordinances on regulatory resolutions of the Common Council.

BE IT ENACTED that Section 38 of Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902, as amended by Chapter 319 of the Laws of 1904, be and hereby are amended, and as amended, established, superseding the said former Sections:

SECTION 38. Time of taking effect of ordinances. Any ordinance enacted by the Common Council may specify the time when it shall take effect, but no ordinance shall take effect until after its publication at least once in the official newspapers of the City, provided there are such, notwithstanding the specifications therein of a previous time for its taking effect. If no time be specified in any ordinance so enacted for its taking effect, it shall take effect immediately, except there be official newspapers of the City at the time, it shall take effect only after its publication in such official newspapers. Provided, however, that any ordinance, zoning law, building or construction code, need not be published in newspapers in full, if there be published a general synopsis thereof and a statement calling attention to the fact that the original ordinance or measure is on file in the City Clerk's Office.

This law shall take effect immediately.
