

Regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, N.Y., held January 16, 1931:

LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 1931 OF THE CITY OF PLATTSBURGH, N.Y.

Entitled "An Act to change Section 152 of the City Charter of Plattsburgh, being part of Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902 of the State of New York, providing for the change of percentage charge on delinquent taxes from two (2) to one (1) per centum.

By Alderman BRAULT, Seconded by Alderman SPEARMAN.


Be it enacted by the Mayor and the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, N.Y., that Section 152 of the City Charter as herein above mentioned and as amended by Chapter 584 of the Laws of 1915, shall be superseded by the following:

Section 152. Notice of Receiving Taxes:- Immediately on the delivery of the city roll and warrant to the chamberlain he shall publish a notice in the official newspapers of the city, that he will attend at his office with said roll and warrant for thirty days next after the first publication of said notice, Sundays and legal holidays excepted, from nine o'clock in the morning to four o'clock in the afternoon, and from seven o'clock post meridian until nine o'clock post meridian of each Saturday during said thirty days to receive taxes so assessed, and it shall be his duty to attend accordingly. All taxes or assessments paid within thirty days after the first publication of the chamberlain's notice shall be payable without fee, percentage or interest thereon. On all taxes or assessments remaining unpaid after the expiration of such thirty days, the chamberlain shall collect one per centum additional, and all remaining unpaid after the expiration of sixty days from such first publication, the chamberlain shall collect interest at the rate of one per centum per month from expiration of said sixty days, which percentage and interest shall belong to the city. (As amended by Chapter 319 of the Laws of 1904. (Amended Ch. 584, Laws of 1915).

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon approval.

On roll call Aldermen Holland, Brault, Lamar, Wallace Bourdeau, Spearman and George Bourdeau voted in the affirmative. No one in the negative. CARRIED.

The above Local Law is hereby approved after Public Hearing held this 26th day of January, 1931.
