

Regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, held February 3, 1939.

LOCAL LAW NO. 1 of 1939.

ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR MILK INSPECTOR.
POSITION TO BE CREATED UNDER AND BY OPEN
COMPETITIVE CIVIL SERVICE REGULATIONS AND
PRESCRIBING DUTIES AND COMPENSATION THEREFOR.

BE IT ENACTED by the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to appoint a Milk Inspector under open competitive Civil Service Regulations. Such Inspector shall be a Registered Veterinarian and either shall have had one year of satisfactory full time experience in Milk Sanitation or shall have completed a course of instruction in Milk Sanitation offered by the Public Health Council of the State of New York as qualified for Grade 2 Milk Inspector. Such Inspector shall also have a knowledge of Meat Inspection.


Section 2. The salary for this position shall be One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per annum, payable semi-monthly on payrolls to be audited and approved by the Mayor and the Secretary of the Municipal Civil Service Commission.

Section 3. The duties of the position shall be performed under the supervision of the Health Officer and shall include inspection of all milk pasteurizing plants, receiving stations and wholesale firms handling milk for consumption in the City; the physical examination of all cows furnishing milk for consumption in the City; the collection and delivery to the laboratory of samples of milk and cream for examination. He shall devote an average of twenty-four (24) hours per week to his official duties. He shall also make monthly reports of his activities to the Common Council and to the Board of Health.


This local law shall take effect February 1st, 1939.
