LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF 1931.

Entitled An Act providing for the payment of the salary of the City Poor Doctor from the General Fund.

By Alderman George BOURDEAU, Seconded by Alderman LAMAR.


BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh that Sub-division B of Section 2 of Local Law No. 5 of 1925 be superseded by the following, which following provision shall be added to and read in connection with Local Law No. 3 of 1928.

A city poor doctor who shall be a competent physician and whose duty it shall be under the direction of the Commissioner of Charities to visit at their places of abode such of the poor of the city as may be ill, and give medical attention and care to the same as their condition shall require. The term of office of the city poor doctor shall be two years, and he shall hold office until the appointment of his successor. He shall receive an annual salary of not to exceed six hundred (\$600.00) dollars, payable out of the General Fund.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon approval.

On roll call Aldermen Holland, Brault, Lamar, Wallace Bourdeau, Spearman and George Bourdeau voted in the affirmative. No one in the negative. CARRIED.

The above Local Law is hereby approved after public hearing held this 26th day of January, 1931.
