## LOCAL LAW NUMBER 5 OF 1932

ENTITLED AN ACT to amend Section 157 of the City Charter of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, being part of Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902 of the State of New York as amended by Chapter 449 of the Laws of 1903 and Chapter 428 of the Laws of 1912, providing for Proceedings in case of failure to collect tax on warrant.

BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, that Section 157 of the City Charter of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, as amended by Chapter 449 of the Laws of 1903 and Chapter 428 of the Laws of 1912, be superseded by the following:

SECTION 157 Proceedings in/case of failure to collect tax on warrant. On or before the first day of November next after any tax or water charge shall have been imposed upon any real estate in said City of Plattsburgh, New York, the chamber-lain shall make and deliver to the assessors a transcript, of any and all such taxes and water charges which remain unpaid on the current assessment roll, and it shall be the duty of the assessors, immediately upon the receipt of such transcript, to make and deliver to the chamberlain a statement containing a brief general description of the location, boundary and estimated quantity of each parcel of said lands, and in case any such lands shall have been erroneously assessed then it shall be the duty of such assessors to make and include in said statement a correct assessment at the same valuation as before, and such corrected assessment and the amount of taxes levied upon said lands, shall be as valid and effectual for all purposes as though they had originally been corrected. The cost of such description, boundary and estimate, not exceeding one dollar for each parcel, shall be audited by the common council and paid to the assessor or assessors furnishing the same.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon approval.

On roll call Aldermen Holland, Roach, Raymond, Light, Spearman and Shay voted in the affirmative. No one in the negative. CARRIED.

The foregoing Local Law is hereby approved after Public Hearing held this 30th day of September, 1932.
